



Rationale for Project

- Present the wide range of creative strategies being applied by First Nation communities.




The Benefits of Developing a Community Housing Plan

- Plans result in continuity in the community housing portfolio they provide hope.
- Planning allows a community to get a handle on what resources are required.
- Plans provide a roadmap allowing the community to see where they are headed.
- Community (not just leadership) views are integrated into a common statement.
- Broader social, economic development and community wellness objectives can be integrated. Housing can be the catalyst to change.




A Community Housing Plan is based on:

- An honest and realistic assessment of the existing conditions and recognized needs for housing in the community.
- The development of a shared vision of what the community's housing will look like in the future.
- The development of goals which will guide the community towards the longer term vision.
- The development of specific workplans (based on assessment of alternative strategies) which will result in attaining the goals.
- Consistent and passionate commitment to implementation of the Plan.




Community Circle Responsibility for Plan Development



Preparing Detailed Workplans / Strategies


Key Steps:



Support Working Groups in their activities

<u>For each Delegated Task</u>

- Clarify the Challenges and the Barriers which might Prevent Attaining the Goals
- Research alternative initiatives / strategies
- Confirm those strategies which will be recommended
- Develop detailed workplans guiding implementation of the strategies
- Clarify the resources which will be required (people, financing, administrative, etc.)
- Define a schedule governing the implementation






Confirming Community Support for the Plan

- Clarify impact of Plan implementation on Community members



Monitoring Progress / Revising the Plan

Key Steps:

- Review Plan implementation on a regular basis
- 🐧 As required, revise plan
- Arrange for Community Meeting as Required
- Clarify impact of Plan implementation on Community members



Plans Which Work

Based on an acknowledgement that the status quo isn't working / recognition of the need for change

- Plans are developed by a broad representation of community members
- Support for innovative approaches to improving housing conditions
- Plans clarify actions and initiatives to be undertaken over a multi-year period
- Implementation is monitored in relation to the stated goals.
- Community champions spearhead the planning process
