In working with the communities we are seeking to:

- Reduce energy use in all homes, thus saving money on energy bills
- Educate community members on the importance of energy conservation and how they can achieve this with simple actions
- Develop a long-term sustainable conservation program to continue addressing energy use and the means to influence the efficiency of the housing stock through improved housing policies

Energy Efficiency Programs

Three basic elements to an energy conservation program:


- 1. Education and awareness (no/low \$)
- 2. Installation of energy saving products (\$\$)
- 3. Energy retrofits (\$\$\$)



1. Education and Awareness

- Distribute free government brochures on conservation
- Share energy saving tips on a Conservation FaceBook page, website, community newsletter, posters, local cable TV
- Host an Energy Conservation Day with the science teachers – kids share energy science
 projects with parents


Energy Conservation Calendar

2. Installation of Energy Saving Products

 - CFL light bulbs
 - Low flow showerhead & faucet aerators
 - pipe wrap
 - Indoor and outdoor timers
 - Foam gaskets for electrical outlets and switches

Hydro One Remote Communities Inc.

Program is diverse:

- Conservation education and tips
- Energy Efficiency free or discounted products
- Special Projects
- Community Conservation Programs
- Commercial lighting retrofits
- Commercial appliance/equipment upgrades
- Energy conservation youth camps

Hydro One Programs

- Hydro One also offers conservation programs to First Nations commercial buildings and institutions:
 - Free energy audit and up to \$1,500 for lighting retrofits
 - Financial incentives for replacing inefficient existing equipment with high efficiency equipment

3. Energy Retrofits

- Expensive to conduct energy audits and do energy retrofit work on homes, but it can be done:
 - Take advantage of CMHC's training to ensure that all new construction and maintenance is done to the highest standards
 - Develop housing policy that ensures homes are built and maintained to the community's standard
 - Through training and policy build construction and maintenance capacity within your community



Funding for Energy Retrofits

- Aboriginal Conservation Program funded by the OPA, administered by First Nations Engineering Services Ltd.
- Launching sometime 2013 application process
- 24 FN Communities will receive energy audits and extensive energy retrofits

Partner with Funders

- Funding provided by the Belleville Rotary Club to pilot shatterproof window film and a solar thermal wall in Fort Albany First Nation
- Film keeps window intact if broken, until replacement is installed
- House air circulates through the solar thermal wall, is warmed by the sun and circulated back to the the home. No electricity required.
 - You just have to ask......









Opportunities for Community Involvement

This program employs community members whenever possible:

- Energy product installers, surveyors, apprentice auditor helpers, energy retrofit contractors
- Local caterers for events
- Commissioning of local artisans to provide energy saving prizes – moccasins and goose down blankets




Developing a Sustainable Conservation Program

- AFN, KFN and FAFN are unique in that they have their own Power Corporations
- They are required by law to implement Conservation Demand Management (CDM) Strategies
- The CDM strategies will (hopefully) begin very con, providing funds for residential and commercial energy retrofits

Develop a Sustainable Conservation Program

- All FN Communities have the ability to develop a sustainable conservation program
- First step: adopt a Community Energy Plan process and develop:
 - energy efficiency policies
 - renewable energy policies
 - housing policies

- Check out funding and support opportunities with the First Nations Market Housing Fund, AANDC, Tech Services, Hydro One, etc.
