- Habitat for Humanity is a not-for-profit organization
- Vision
 - A world where everyone has a safe and decent place to live
- Mission
 - To mobilize community partners and volunteers in building affordable housing and promoting home ownership as a means of breaking the cycle of poverty
- Habitat for Humanity International
 - 100 countries
 - 350,000 homes
 - 1.75 million people provided safe, decent and affordable housing
 - Today delivering a house every 21 minutes

- Habitat for Humanity Canada was founded in 1985 with the formation of the first Canadian affiliate in Winkler, Manitoba.
- Nationwide, there are now 73 affiliates and 61 ReStores in 10 provinces and two territories.
- As of today, with help from over 50,000 volunteers, Habitat for Humanity Canada has served almost 1,800 families nationwide.

HOW WE HELP – a hand up, not a hand out

 Using monetary donations, volunteer labour and donated materials, Habitat purchases land, builds homes and sells them to partner families with no down payment and zero-interest mortgages that are geared to income.



- Affordable mortgages reduce the financial stress on families, allowing them to take care of other needs such as childcare, transportation, groceries, education, clothing, etc.
- Partner families' monthly mortgage payments go into a revolving fund that is used to build homes for other families in need.



HOW WE HELP – a hand up, not a hand out

Make affordable housing accessible to low income families

Core Program – Homeownership through partnership

Habitat Homes

- Constructed using donated funds, material and labour
- Sold to partner families through a no-profit, no-interest mortgage
- Finance with payments set at 30% of gross income or less
- Supporting additional families when mortgage payments are invested

Partner families become part of their own housing solution

- Contribute sweat equity and participate in valuable training and preparation
- Obtain access to affordable housing, help families build equity for the future

HABITAT'S OTHER PROGRAMS

ReStore

- Sell donated new and used building supplies
- Divert building products away from land fills

ReNew It

Assist low-income home-owners with repairs and minor renovations

Sustainable Building

Promotes recognized green building practices

 Opportunity for women to raise funds, build homes, raise awareness for affordable housing

- Canadians work in developing countries and disaster stricken areas

Aboriginal Housing Program - Pilot

- Aboriginal Housing Program A Pilot
- A Partnership between Habitat for Humanity and CMHC
 - Expressly designed to help more Aboriginal families access Habitat homes, on and off reserve
 - Other important partners include: Aboriginal housing organizations,
 Aboriginal leaders and community; other levels of government; and industry

Alberta longer term agreement 15-20 units annually.

Approximately 40-45 units by end of 2011

- 22 homes build and occupied by partner Aboriginal families
- 5 homes to be occupied early 2011
- Agreements signed 20
- Longer Term commitment of 15-20 units annually in Alberta
- Many more units out side of AHP



Two projects

First Project -10 homes

- Habitat Winnipeg
 - Manitoba Métis Federation
 - Government of Manitoba
 - Sustainable Forestry Industry
 - Ten houses built and sold to partner families in 2009 -2010

■ **Second Project** – 10 homes

- Dakota Ojibway Tribal Council
- Five homes under construction
- Occupancy in late November and early next year
- Second sets of five houses in 2011











- HFH Edmonton Two Projects Planned
- First project
 - Agreement signed with First Nation Housing Development Corporation/TSAG
 - Build 10 units 2010/2011
 - Enbridge an important partner
 - Two homes under construction
 - One family selected and other underway
 - Balance under consideration for 2011
- Second Project A Pilot
- Partnership Agreement under final negotiations between HFH –Edmonton and Métis Capital Housing Corporation of Alberta
- To renovate and sale 5 units coming off the operating subsidies to Métis families
 - Units to be transferred to HFH Edmonton
 - HFH to fund, renovate and sell units to qualified Métis families



- HFH Thunder Bay
 - Retrofit and Expansion

- Barrie
 - Semidetached home planned
 - Did not materialize



Demand

- Awareness Aboriginal community
- Marketing outreach
 - Aboriginal housing conferences
 - Communication -Testimonies in local Aboriginal media

Supply

- Continued support from affiliates
 - Partnership in developing strategy
- Resources
- Creative Partnership
 - Correction Canada
 - Aboriginal Housing Authorities
 - Academic institutions
 - Large Corporations
 - Development and Building industry

- AHP Development Projects
 - New Construction
 - Retrofit
 - On Reserves
 - Aboriginal families living outside Reserves
- Transforming AHP Pilot to Sustainable Program
 - Warrants addressing supply and demand of Aboriginal housing
 - Partnership and support needed from Aboriginal community
- Seeking partners willing to work with Habitat in building future of our Aboriginal families

Next steps for partnering on AHP

 - Identify Aboriginal families that would qualify to be potential partner family
